Admission Policy

This document sets out to provide the policy and procedures for a pupil's admission to All Saints School, Lessingham.

- It is the policy of All Saints School to interview pupils irrespective of the information
 previously received and providing the pupil is age appropriate and it is felt that the
 prospective pupil would benefit from the education provided by the school, a place will be
 offered.
- All Saints School is a main stream school and accepts pupils with a wide range of educational ability, pupils are taught in appropriate classes to allow all to achieve their potential.
- The school can offer additional support to those who have Special Educational Needs including serious Health issues, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Attention Deficit Disorder, and Aspergers Syndrome (Social and communication difficulties).
- All Saints School is also able to provide a nurturing environment for those pupils who have been unable to access mainstream education, using a process of gradual integration with the aim of full school attendance. The school works closely with local authorities to provide a structured and consistent environment for young people who are considered to be vulnerable and who would benefit from attending a small school.
- There is no entrance exam for All Saints, admission is by interview with the Head teacher or nominated staff member often without the pupil if it is felt to be beneficial. An opportunity will then be given for the young person to visit and if appropriate invited to have two trial days where they can be informally assessed and join with their peers in class lessons and activities.
- All Saints School does not admit pupils whose specific difficulties relate primarily to their behaviour. It is essential for the well-being of all, that new pupils can be seen to fit in with their peers in a positive and constructive manner. The decision to offer a place will be made by the Head teacher following consultation with relevant staff and a letter of acceptance will be sent within five working days to the parents or placing authority.
- An offer of a place will be made providing the pupil's presence at the school will not be detrimental to the education or social wellbeing of other pupils in the school and where it is felt that the school is able to meet the specific needs of the pupil.
- All Saints accept entries into the school throughout the year and understands that for all pupils changing schools or attending after long absences can be extremely difficult and the transition needs to be completed with empathy and support from all pupils and staff and close liaison with parents/carers.

<u>Absence</u>

If your child is going to be absent from school, please telephone to let us know. The Head Teacher will be in school from 8.15am. If you do not contact us on the morning of your child's absence, you will be contacted by the School Office. It is important that we receive a note, giving the reason for absence, when your son or daughter returns to school.

If your child is absent for a period of time without contact from parents or carers, the school is required to notify the Attendance Team in the Local Authority.

Following recent guidance from the Department for Education, it has been recommended that Head Teachers should refuse requests for family holidays during term time, unless there are exceptional circumstances. If parents still intend to have a family holiday during term time, you are asked to complete a holiday request form which is available from the school office.

<u>Uniform</u>

All students are expected to dress correctly for school.

School sweatshirts, polo shirts, ties, badges and school coats can be bought from the school via the school office. Please find enclosed the uniform list and order form.

All uniform must be named.

Please note that if a student arrives at school inappropriately dressed, (ie: not in correct uniform), they may be sent home to dress appropriately. Also, if a student arrives in school with brightly coloured dyed hair, their parents will be asked to come and collect them from school. They will not be allowed back in school until their hair is a suitable colour.

Lost Property

We have a lost property cupboard which contains un-named uniform and equipment. Please notify the school office if your son or daughter has lost something and we will do our best to find the lost item.

Personal Information

Please let us know immediately of any change of circumstances. Confidential matters will be handled discreetly by the Head Teacher.

Please ensure that school records are always up to date including contact names, telephone numbers and e-mail addresses which are vital for emergency contact. This is a legal requirement. Any notification of changes should be given to us in writing as soon as possible, or e-mailed to <u>office@allsaintslessingham.co.uk</u>.

Medicines

In accordance with our First Aid and Medication Policy any medicine which needs to be administered in school time should be brought to the office, clearly named and with dosage instructions where it will be securely stored. This needs to be accompanied by a Parental Agreement for School to Administer Medicine form, giving permission for the school staff to administer the medication. The staff in the school office will keep a record of any medication which is administered.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones are forbidden in school. If you want your son or daughter to have a mobile phone, they must hand it in to the Head Teacher or Form Tutor first thing in the morning and it will be returned to them at the end of the day. If a student is found to have a mobile phone, it will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day on the Friday. If your son or daughter needs to contact you during the day they can use the phone in the school office.

Please note that I-pods and personal stereos/mp3 players are also forbidden in school. If these items are brought into school, again, they should be handed in. The school does not take responsibility for the loss of mobile phone, i-pods or any other electrical equipment.

Confiscated Items

Items which have been confiscated, such as jewellery, mobile phones, mp3 players, I-Pods, non uniform clothing can be collected from the school office at 3:10pm on Fridays. If necessary, a confiscated item may be collected sooner by a parent from reception.

Jewellery

Students may wear two simple ear studs or small hoops, one in each ear. These should be removed or covered for PE, (for Health and Safety Reasons). Additional studs or rings on any other part of the body will be confiscated.

All other jewellery such as bracelets are forbidden.

<u>Tattoos</u>

Tattoos are illegal on persons under the age of 16 and suggest that these are left until your son/daughter has left All Saints School.

Arrival at School

School starts at 9am with registration.

Ideally, students should arrive at school from 8:40am. Those who, for special reasons, have to arrive before this time, need to report to the Head Teacher in the school building to ensure that they are safe. We cannot ensure any level of supervision before 8:30am.

Car Parking

The safety of our students is paramount. Parents dropping off their children in the morning are asked to park alongside the school fence leaving the gateways free.

At the end of the day, parents are asked to drive into the playground through the far gate and exit through the middle gate. School staff will supervise the safe departure of each child. Parents who have children in the Junior and Senior school are asked to arrive at 3:15pm. The younger children will be kept in the Junior Department from 3pm as a safety requirement.

Lunches:

All students at All Saints eat packed lunches. We would like to encourage healthy eating at school. We have a water machine which supplies us with cooled water. Students are asked to bring a bottle of water, (rather than a sugary drink), which they can refill during the day. The Juniors and Seniors currently eat their lunch in the Hall.

All students are expected to go outside at lunchtimes unless the weather is inclement.

Extreme Weather

Please assume that the school will be open. We will publish details on local radio, our website or via emergency contact numbers if the school needs to close.

House Teams

Each student in school is allocated to a house team. Each house has a house captain (Senior student). Stars and credits are given to individual students. These will go towards house points. Events will be held throughout the year where teamwork will be encouraged, such as Sports Day, Swimming Gala, etc.

SCHOOL RULES

Our Golden Rules were devised by the teachers and students as a basis for maintaining a safe, happy and busy school where everyone feels valued.

Expectations around the school:

- All members of the school community should respect one another and act with consideration and courtesy towards each other.
- Show respect for your own and other people's property.
- Be polite towards staff and fellow pupils at all times.
- Be honest and always tell the truth.
- Do your best and be responsible for your own behaviour and work.
- To walk through the school sensibly and quietly.
- Be attentive and listen carefully during lessons.
- Be kind and helpful towards one another, thereby contributing to make All Saints School a friendly and happy school.
- To be on time for registration and for each lesson.
- To have the correct equipment for each lesson (eg: pens, pencils, ruler, rubber, pencil sharpener etc).
- To take pride in the work displayed around the school.
- To look after the school building and all equipment with care and respect.
- Wear the correct school uniform and have the correct kit for PE.
- To behave appropriately on school transport. Students who fail to behave appropriately will not be allowed to travel on the school bus.

Expectations at break times:

- During school breaks, all students are to go outside unless given permission by the Head Teacher to stay inside.
- When the weather is unfavourable, then students will be expected to go to their form rooms where they will be supervised.

Lunch time arrangements:

• Junior school students have play time from 12.00 until 12.30. They eat their lunch in the Hall. Senior lunch time is between 12.30 and 1.00pm. All Senior school students will eat their lunch in the hall. Students will remain in the hall until 12.45pm when they can go outside for a 15 minute break.

Expectations with regards to work and learning:

- To be punctual for all lessons.
- To be prepared for lessons with the correct exercise books, text books, pencil case etc.
- To raise a hand before contributing to class discussion.
- To co-operate with others.
- To listen attentively to adults in the class.
- To attempt tasks independently.
- To try to achieve the highest possible standard.
- To attempt the given task without wasting time. If students waste class time, they will be expected to make up the time at break times or lunch times.
- If a child has three break time detentions, they will be expected to complete an after school detention on Fridays. Parents will be fully informed.
- To complete homework tasks within the required time.
- Adhere to, and abide by the school ICT contract.

Prohibitions:

- No article which may cause physical or material harm is to be brought into school. This includes matches and cigarettes and particularly illegal substances and weapons, possession of which will lead to permanent exclusion.
- Inviting other pupils to take drugs outside of school will also lead to permanent exclusion.
- Smoking or involvement in drugs are both absolutely prohibited in school, on the way to and from school and in any other circumstances in which the good name of the school would be brought into disrepute.
- It is now an offence to smoke anywhere on the school site.
- Chewing gum must not be brought into school.
- Liquid paper correcting fluid, (eg: Tippex) must not be brought to school.
- No electronic equipment of any sort, (eg: radio/personal stereo, mobile phone, pager, mp3 player, camera, ipad or laptop) or other electrical equipment is to be brought to school unless officially authorised. Such equipment will be confiscated by staff.
- Money or valuables should not normally be brought into school, but if this is unavoidable, they should be left with the Form Tutors or in the School Office. The school takes no responsibility for money or valuables.

School Uniform:

• School uniform must be worn correctly at all times (see uniform lists for Juniors and Seniors).



CURRICULUM

TRANSPORT

Many children arrive at school by car and parents are encouraged to join our travel plan and car share or allow their son/daughter to cycle to school. Transport is available from the Great Yarmouth, Sheringham and North Walsham areas at a cost of £360.00 per term, to help towards the general running costs of the vehicle.

MUSIC LESSONS

All individual music lessons are by arrangement with the Music teacher concerned to include piano, recorder, voice and guitar.

PAYING BY INSTALMENTS

Some parents may prefer to pay School Fees by an instalment system. This can be arranged on a 12-month basis by Direct Debit, commencing September of each year. Payments will be due on the first day of each month from September to August, inclusive. Any payment defaults will result in the removal of the pupil from school.

Please note that payment for Year 11 students is only available on a 10-month basis.

The entry fee for this academic year for Edexcel and AQA is £45.00 per GCSE subject. Non payment will result in the withdrawal of a candidate.
