


Year 10 Curriculum Guide



Summer Term 2018

English

In English this term Year 10 will be completing their study of 'Macbeth', a set text for GCSE English Literature paper 1.

They will be revising the skills required for effective Speaking and Listening, in preparation for an individual presentation for final GCSE assessment in 2019.

They will work on the requirements of the Functional Skills Level 1 paper which they will sit in May this year. Many of the skills overlap with those assessed in GCSE English Language, papers 1 and 2. In June students will sit an end of year test using past papers, which will helpfully identify areas of weakness needing to be addressed.

We will also read and study a second English Literature text for paper 1, 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens.

Philosophy and Ethics

Once we have completed the Christianity Beliefs and Practices element of the course we will be moving on to the first of four modules which examine ethical issues.

This topic is entitled Good and Evil and covers issues such as Crime and Punishment, Forgiveness and Suffering. We will examine these topics from Christian and Humanist perspectives.

Performance Skills

We will be improving pupils ability to play their instrument/sing together both as part of an ensemble and as a soloist. We will be focusing on cover songs.

Recording Technology

We will be looking at basic recording techniques and mixing techniques.

Homework

Pupils will be expected to practice their pieces of music at home – it is unrealistic to imagine they can learn to play pieces purely within the 1hour 30mins lesson at school.

There will also be elements of research required for different topics.

In ICT this term Year 10 will be covering the following topics:

Art

‘Fragments’ - The second project in the GCSE course will build on skills and techniques established previously. The theme lends itself to abstraction to enable individual interpretation. Work will be developed from the initial study of artists. Again, observational drawing will play a key roll with particular emphasis on composition. Any weaknesses from the last project should be recognized and rectified in this one.

Building on work done last term pupils are working individually.

Artist studies, Recording (observational drawing, taking photographs and annotation). Using a variety of materials and using the above to develop their ideas including layout in their sketchbook.
