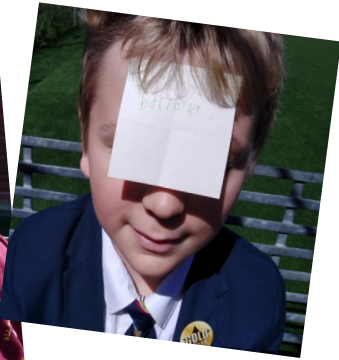

In order to make the event a success, we need tombola and raffle prizes. If you have anything you are able to donate, please send it to the office by Monday 1st July.

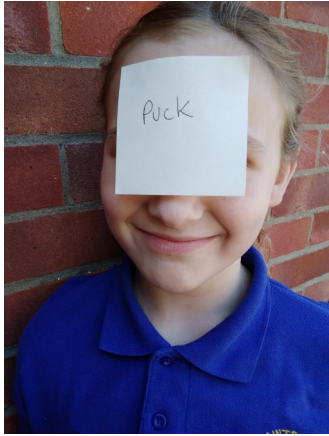
Thank you to those who have already sent items in; special thanks to Cameron's family who have made and donated some amazing baskets in to include in our raffle.

The Big Norfolk Holiday Fun activity programme provides holiday activities for children and young people aged 5-16 (or 4 if your child is slightly younger but in school) throughout the holidays.

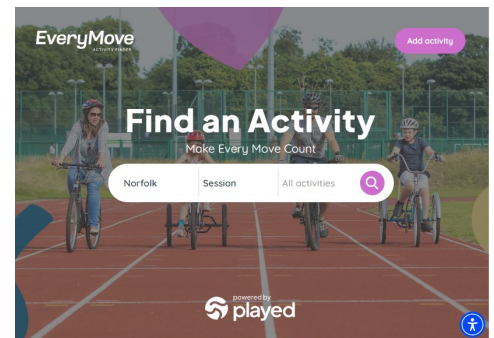
Next week, you can sign up your children for some fantastic activities during the summer holidays. Children aged 4-16 who receive benefits-related free school meals can sign up to 16 sessions of fun at no cost.

Those who claim means-tested free school meals can claim free spaces on the activities, whilst paid spots are available on many activities for those who don't. To be eligible for Big Norfolk Holiday Fun activities you must be registered on the Norfolk County Council's database for means-tested free school meals.
