Norfolk County Council has issued new Leave of Absence guidelines for independent settings. The letter was sent to all parents earlier this week; this and the absence request form are on the school website and the form must be completed for all absence requests https://www.allsaintslessingham.co.uk/attendance/

Please do read it carefully; it is clear that any term time holidays which result in 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) could result in the Local Authority (LA) prosecuting parents under section 444 of the Education Act 1996, which can result in a criminal conviction and fine of up to £2,500.


