Curriculum Overview for Year 9 Autumn Term 2

It is incredible that it is already time to write and tell you what we will be learning about this Half Term. After Half Term, we will be learning the following:

English

Maths

Science

In Year 9 Science this half-term we will be studying the topic Respiration, Food and Digestion. This biology topic builds on prior learning about cells and organs and also aspects of healthy living to look in detail at some of the major organ systems of the body.
