# Metacognition

As a school, our focus for the next two terms is Metacognition . We are encouraging staff and students to really think about the process of learning and what our brains are doing when we absorb new information. Our staff are all trained to recognise how different people learn and will be supporting students by employing different strategies to help your child to learn effectively.



The next steps for us as a school, are to encourage students to think about their own learning process and become more effective at using strategies that help them independently, so they are able to problem solve and tackle new things with more autonomy.

## Sustainable Sensory Garden

This month the Eco Committee, in collaboration with the School Council, have launched a competition to help design a sustainable sensory garden which will be situated at the front of the school. Students at All Saints expressed a keen interest in creating a garden for themselves and future generations to enjoy, understanding the benefits of having a quiet, natural space for everyone. This is also a fabulous opportunity to design an area that will improve the sustainability of the school by encouraging a diverse range of plants, insects and birds to thrive as well as a garden that will withstand the climate changes we may experience in the coming years, things like drier summers, wetter springs and milder winters.

## How to enter the "Design a Sustainable Sensory Garden" competition

To enter the competition, students can either fill in the competition entry form online (email Mr. Slater) or ask their form tutor for a paper entry form. They can then draw diagrams or pictures of all the ideas they have and how they imagine the garden should look. We will pick up to 5 designs and use the key ideas from these to create the garden. A commemoration plaque will be installed in the garden with the winning designers' names on.




