If you would like to support your child's learning at home, we thought it would be helpful for you to have a more detailed idea of what we are learning about.

Maths

In Maths we will be looking at the topic of Fractions, Decimals and Percentages. Students will continue to work on Maths in the groups that provide them with the right amount of challenge and support. English

In English this term, the students will be creating their own mythological stories, using descriptive language to develop thrilling plots, characters and settings, before introducing a flashback as a structural technique to develop their story writing.

SPAG

Students will learn how to use personification, metaphor and simile in their story writing. They will also be using subordinate clauses and noun phrases.

Geography

In this unit - called Local Study - students will use fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods including sketch maps, plans, graphs and digital technologies.

Science

Mr Slater will be investigating the classification of rocks by their initial formation and their observable characteristics. The class will investigate the composition of soil to further draw on their practical science skills and their powers of observation.

This unit looks at how a flat-file database can be used to organise data in records. Pupils use tools within a database to order and answer questions about data. They create graphs and charts from their data to help solve problems. They use a real-life database to answer a question, and present their work to others.
