English

In English this term, the students will be learning about Charles Dickens and the book Oliver Twist. Students will read Oliver Twist as well as watch an adaptation. Students will produce fact files about Charles Dickens and explain why he was so important to Britain, improve their knowledge of descriptive and figurative language to describe and analyse characteristics of the main characters of Oliver Twist.

You can always help by reading together, either aloud or just encouraging them to make time to read at home. We will be using the school library regularly and will also have a book box that relates to our learning in the classroom. The best homework is to read regularly and this will have the greatest impact on progress, regardless of how fluently they are able to read.

We will be exploring and discussing the following topics: Learning Skills, Choices and Pathways, Work and Career and Employment.

Philosophy and Ethics

During this term, students will be learning about Buddhism.

Maths

In Maths we will be looking at the topic of Fractions, Decimals and Percentages. Students will continue to work on Maths in the groups that provide them with the right amount of challenge and support. Humanities

Humanities will have a **History** focus for the rest of the spring term. We will be focusing on an exciting topic - The Industrial Revolution. This includes cotton production, steam engines, iron, coal and looking at children in the workplace.

Once again we will be putting our Historian hats on and looking at sources and evidence to consider continuity and change!

Science

In Science this half-term Year 8 will be finishing off the Waves topic, then studying Inheritance and Selection. This Biology topic introduces ideas about how species are formed and how they are different. Students will also be introduced to DNA, genetics and genetic diseases.
