

assistive technology programme to support students with reading. This is to use once the Fresh Start intervention is completed. Some students have completed a 4 week trial and have really enjoyed it and the data shows it has a big impact on comprehension, reading speed and vocabulary. Letters will go home next week with details of logins for the students we have identified as benefitting from it. The more students engage with this, the faster their progress will be, so please support where you can at home. We will make time for it in school too.

KS2 students really enjoyed collecting careers linked objects for their staff careers talk scavenger hunt.








KS3 and 4 students prepared excellent questions for staff and loved hearing about different career journeys.

"I didn't know what some of these words meant but after looking them up it turned out I was lots of them." Year 8 student.


Careers Week Sign Up Sheet


I am Energetic, professional editor, good coordination skills, good with technology, good at thinking ahead, good at reacting fast
